Non-collection of a child procedure

It is not mandatory for a parent/guardian to remain on the premises during club sessions but they must be contactable during the training session. All Reception Group children (7-11 years) must be dropped off and registered into an allocated group by a parent/guardian. They must also be collected and signed out by a recognised adult at the conclusion of each session. Children aged 11 and over are free to join and leave junior sessions without a parent/guardian signing them in/out but club coaches must be assured that all are accounted for before leaving the premises where the session is taking place.

In the event that the parent/guardian is not there to collect the child (aged 7-11) at 20.15 or if the child exhibits distress before that time, the following procedure must be followed:

- 1. Ensuring the other children at the session are looked after appropriately, two adults (a club coach, official + 1 other) should approach the child, making sure not to frighten or alarm him/her.
- 2. They should find out the child's name and age and use the contact details held by the club officials to telephone the parent/guardian.
- 3. In the meantime, two adults should stay with the child, while another volunteer searches the immediate vicinity for the parent.
- 4. If, after 20 minutes, the parent cannot be located or contacted by telephone the police should be called.
- 5. At no time should the child be left unaccompanied, and the volunteers should remain with the child until the police arrive.
- 6. The volunteers should assist the police with their activities at all times.
- 7. An Incident Report form via England Athletics online portal should be completed by the relevant club coach within 3 days of the incident. The club welfare officer should also be informed of all details.
- 8. Repeated incidents of non-collection should be addressed by the club coach, in consultation with the club welfare officer. Possible outcomes are a warning to the parent, or suspension of the child from club training sessions.
